POLICY: Newburgh Board of Education

Non-Resident Pupils Tuition

Non-resident pupils are defined as those whose parents or legal guardians reside outside of the School District. Emancipated minors and students over the age of eighteen (18) who live outside of the school district shall also be defined as non-resident students.

Parents wishing to enroll their children on a non-resident basis must seek admittance by written request, indicating age and grade level of each student. A review of the request by the Superintendent will include availability of space, program needs for the prospective non-resident student, and disruption of educational programs of students presently enrolled in District schools.

Non-resident students seeking admittance to a Newburgh Magnet School will be considered after the placement lottery has been completed and all resident students have been placed in their school of choice.

It is the policy of the Board to assess tuition charges for each non-resident student attending school in this District. Tuition rates shall be set by the District in accordance with state mandated procedures. The tuition rates shall be made known to the sender prior to the enrollment of the non-resident pupil.

Individual tuition charges must be paid in advance of each semester or the student shall be precluded from attending upon instruction.

In order to preserve the continuity of a student's educational program and social development, the Board will accept non-resident students into the schools of this District on a tuition-free basis for a 90 calendar day period upon the submission of proof of a home rental or purchase in this District calling for occupancy within that period by parent or legal guardian. Should the time prior to occupancy exceed 90 calendar days, the child will be permitted to continue in the schools of this District upon the prepayment of a monthly tuition fee.

Parents of District students who move out of this District on or after May 1 may continue their child in school until the conclusion of the school year at no cost, provided that overcrowding does not exist. Parents of District children moving prior to that date may continue their child in school until the end of the term upon the prepayment of a monthly tuition fee. Students in grade 12 who are scheduled to graduate with their class may complete their education in the District at no cost for tuition. In all such cases, transportation of the out-of-district student will be the responsibility of the parent.

In the event that the Board permits on a tuition basis the attendance of a non-resident student whose parent or guardian owns property in the District and pays a tax on such property, the Board will deduct from the tuition fee the amount of such school tax.
