WHAT DOES BEING A BOARD MEMBER MEAN?

The Board of Education members are a nine person policy-making body which operates within the laws of the State of New York. Each member is elected for a three-year term; terms of office are staggered with elections held every year in May. The Board is responsible for approving the district's budget, adopting all policies and curriculum, and evaluating the superintendent. The authority of the Board is as a whole and no Board member may act as an official of the district except when the board meets in a regular or a special session. The Board of Trustees are elected to represent all of the people of the school district. In making its decisions, the Board is guided by what is in the best interest of the entire district.

LIBRARY & BUDGET VOTE/BOE MEMBER **ELECTION - MAY 19. 2026**

Polls are open from 12:00 P.M. (noon) until 9 P.M. in designated school buildings. Board of Education member vacancies are on the ballot yearly. An election calendar will be issued yearly which will include registration dates, availability of petitions and other pertinent data. A person is entitled to vote at a school district vote/election if he/she is:

- 1. A citizen of the United States.
- 2. Eighteen years of age or older.
- 3. A resident within the school district for 30 days preceding the vote/election.
- 4. Registered with the County Board of Elections or with the school district on the Special Registration Day designated by the school district.

"In accordance with Section 1716 of the Education Law, copies of the school district budget shall be available 14 days preceding the date of the budget vote/election."

OUR PROGRAMS

UNIVERSAL PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

The full-day Universal Pre-K (UPK) Program provides a comprehensive and developmentally age-appropriate program for eligible NECSD four-year olds. The daily schedule is thoughtfully planned to support early childhood development and is aligned to NYSED Office of Early Learning program expectations and Standards. The UPK program includes purposeful play activities supported by teaching staff who encourage experimentation, exploration, and inquiry. A typical day in any of our UPK includes a balance between individual and small group activities, active and guiet activities, and self initiated activities in interest areas. The Universal Pre-K Program contributes to the continuing growth of young children's knowledge and an understanding of themselves and the world in which they live. Learning experiences provide opportunities for children to develop language, literacy, thinking skills, physical abilities, mathematics understanding, and social and emotional learning skills. The Universal Pre-K Program is available at the following elementary schools: Balmville, Gardnertown Leadership Academy, Gidney Avenue Memorial School (GAMS). EXCEPTIONAL LEARNERS

The NECSD is dedicated to improving educational outcomes for students with disabilities and their families. Students with disabilities are identified through a referral and evaluation process as defined through the New York State Part 200 Regulations.

Once identified, students are eligible to receive instruction, supports, and services designed to provide access to the general education curriculum through the development of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). As required by law, supports and services are determined based upon the assessed needs and provided in the least restrictive environment in order to enable the student to gain educational benefit.

In the event you suspect your child may be struggling academically, please contact the principal of the school your child attends and request a meeting to discuss possible solutions. Each building has a Response to Intervention (RTI) team that can determine necessary academic interventions, monitor progress, and/or refer a student to the Committee on Special Education.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

The district offers bilingual education (Transitional & Dual Language) and English as a New Language (ENL) programs. The overall goal of these programs is to provide English Language Learners (ELLs) with the necessary language skills to be successful in all aspects of their academics.

The Transitional Bilingual education program uses the Spanish language to help transition ELLs to proficiency in English while continuing to develop their cognitive and academic skills with Spanish language support. Transitional Bilingual services are available for Spanish-speaking students at Gardnertown, Gidney Avenue, Meadow Hill, South Middle School, and NFA Main Campus.

The Dual Language program aims to build proficiency in both English and Spanish for ELLs and for native English-speaking children. The Dual Language education program uses English and Spanish for literacy and content instruction. The Dual Language program is available at Fostertown School (Two-Way Model) and Vails Gate STEAM Academy (One-Way Model).

The ENL program provides language support to build English language skills and proficiency. All district schools offer ENL services.

NEWBURGH FREE LIBRARY

The Newburgh Free Library serves all families living in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District and has digital and print resources to help students and their families succeed. Use your free library card to download our hoopla and Libby Apps to give you access to eBooks, comics, graphic novels, audiobooks, music and much more. As you know, the school district has a policy that outlines the expectations for student attendance. A copy of Policy number 5100 Comprehensive Student Attendance is available on the school district's website.

One part of the policy states that, "no individual is authorized to change a student's attendance record beyond five (5) school days after returning to school" (e.g., changing an unexcused absence to an excused absence).



REAL-TIME UPDATES ON YOUR CHILD

The following are the expectations for written notes explaining an absence. Please provide the required written documentation for the reason your child was absent within five (5) days of their return. Documentation received beyond the five (5) days will no longer be accepted and the student's record will be marked as an unexcused absence(s) for that occurrence. Should you have any questions, please contact your school principal. A student or his/her parent(s)/guardian will have the right to appeal in writing within ten (10) school days of the student's return to the building principal or designee regarding the accuracy of the number of or type of absences for any class. The building principal or designee's decision may be appealed to the Superintendent of Schools or designee within ten (10) school days of the Principal's determination.

For tardies and early departures, the written excuse should be presented to the school on the day of the tardy or early departure with the reason for the tardy or early departure.

HEALTH SERVICES

School Health Services plays a key role in identifying health risk factors and fostering resilience to support students in achieving their best possible health and well-being. Our team includes a medical director, health services facilitator, nurse practitioner, school nurse teacher, registered nurse, health aide, and clerk. Together, they collaborate with families, healthcare providers, and school communities to address the physical, emotional, social, and educational needs of students from Pre-K through 12th grade. Each district school is equipped with a well-staffed, well-resourced health office that promotes positive health attitudes and behaviors, with a strong focus on preventive care.

DISPENSING OF MEDICATION

If a student is required to take medication during school hours, the medicine must be provided in its original container and clearly labeled with the date prescribed, the student's name, the name of the medication, dosage, and the time it should be administered. A completed parental permission form and a physician's order are required for all medications.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information cards are distributed during the first week of school and should be completed and returned as soon as possible. The details provided are essential for contacting you in the event of an emergency. Please inform the School Health Office promptly if any of the information changes during the school year.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS

The New York State Education Department requires a physical examination for all students entering school at any grade level, as well as for those in Pre-K, Kindergarten, and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11. A physical is also mandatory for participation in school sports, obtaining working papers, and for the Committee on Special Ed. (CSE) triennial review. Physical exams are valid for one year from the last day of the month in which they were conducted, unless the student experiences an illness or injury lasting more than five days, which may invalidate the exam. The exam must be completed within 12 months prior to the start of the school year in which it is required, and documentation must be submitted within 30 days of entering school or the specified grade.

SPORTS PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

All students participating in interscholastic athletics are required to have a current physical exam and/or Health Interval Review, along with clearance from the Health Office, which is processed through the Final Forms registration platform. Sports physicals may be provided at school by the nurse practitioner while school is in session, excluding the summer months.

SCHOOL ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The school accident insurance offers partial coverage only. All medical expenses must first be submitted to the family's primary insurance provider before being sent to the school's insurance company. Parents/guardians are responsible for any remaining balance after the school insurance claim has been processed. All insurance forms should be completed promptly and mailed directly to the school insurance company by the parent or guardian.

IMMUNIZATION EXEMPTIONS

On June 13, 2019, the Governor of New York signed legislation removing religious exemptions for immunizations. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the nurse's office at your child's school. Requests for medical exemptions must be submitted to your child's health office using the New York State-mandated form

REGISTRATION OFFICE

All students entering the district must begin the registration process online. The Registration Office for the Newburgh Enlarged City School District is located at 124 Grand Street. Applicants are addressed on a first-come first-served basis after submitting the application.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE. Students may only be registered by a parent, guardian or case worker.

Admission to Pre-Kindergarten is open to those students who turn four (4) years of age on or before December 1st of the current school year.

Admission to Kindergarten is open to those students who turn five (5) years of age on or before December 1st of the current school year.

Parents or guardians are required to provide the following documentation in order to register their children for school:

1. Proof of Age

- Original or Certified Transcription of your child's Birth Certificate or Baptismal Certificate (regardless of the issuing nation)
- If you are unable to provide either of the above documents, your child's Passport regardless of the issuing nation.
- In the absence of the above documents, you may provide any other documentation that has been in existence for over two years that could be used to establish your child's age. For example:
 - a.) official driver's license or non-driver identification card;
 - b.) state or local government issued identification;
 - c.) military dependent identification card;
 - d.) school photo identification with date of birth;
 - e.) consulate identification cards;
 - f.) hospital or health records;
 - g.) documents issued by federal, state or local agencies (e.g., local service agency, federal Office of Refugee Resettlement);
 - h.) court orders or other court issued documents;
 - i.) Native American tribal document; or
 - j.) records from non-profit international aid agencies and voluntary agencies.

2. Proof of Residency

You must submit at least one (1) of the following documents and at least one (1) item from Supplementary Proof of Residency (below):

- A residential lease (preferably signed within the last 3 months) with current rent receipt (the District reserves the right to also request a Statement of Landlord or Owner, attached)
- · A mortgage or deed
- A statement from a landlord concerning your tenancy

Supplementary Proof of Residency

You may submit any other relevant evidence you wish to, including but not limited to the following types of documentation with current address to indicate residency:

3. Proof of Custody, Guardianship or Foster Care

- You must submit a supplementary proof of residency which may be one of the following: Current utility bill (gas, electric, telephone, cable) with the location of service indicated
- · Current Pay Stub with address
- Income Tax Form
- Membership Documents based on residency (e.g., library card)
- Voter registration documents
- Official Driver's License, learner's permit or non-driver identification
- State or other government issued identification
- Documents issued by federal, state or local agencies

(e.g., local social service agency, federal Office of Refugee Resettlement, Social Security SSI, Child Support)

4. Immunization (Shot) Record

Students who do not have documentation of receiving any, or an insufficient number of, immunizations or proof of immunity may be permitted to attend school for a grace period of not more than 14 calendar days, which may be extended to not more than 30 calendar days for a student who is transferring from out of state or from another country and can show a good faith effort to get the necessary evidence of immunization. (10NYCRR 66-4). After the grace period, the student may be excluded from attendance.

5. Copy of Last Physical Exam

Must be within 12 months of start of school year

- 6. Government Issued Picture ID of the Parent/Guardian
- 7. If available, Current Report Card, Transcript (and IEP if applicable)

Registration hours are from 8:30AM to 3:30PM, Monday through Friday, except holidays in alignment with the school district calendar.

BUS SAFETY RULES

The safety of our students is our primary concern. To help ensure the safety of all students, other motorists and the general public, please make sure your child is aware of the following regulations:

Any student who does not follow these guidelines may lose the privilege of riding the bus.

Bus Safety Rules for Riding the Bus

- 1. Students must follow the instructions of their driver.
- 2. Students must remain in their seats while the bus is in motion, keeping aisles clear at all times.
- 3. Students must remain quiet and orderly; stop, look and listen with the bus driver at all railroad crossings.
- Students must be courteous to the bus driver and fellow passengers. No fighting, yelling or throwing objects. Foul language or rude behavior will not be tolerated.
- 5. Students are not permitted to smoke, eat or drink on the bus and must help to keep the bus neat and clean.

Bus Safety Rules for the Bus Stop

- Students must leave home early enough to arrive at the bus stop ten minutes before the bus is due.
- 2. Students must wait for their bus well off the roadway and respect the property of others.
- 3. Students must enter the bus in a single file and in an orderly manner.
- 4. When leaving the bus, if students must cross a street they should walk 10 feet in front of the bus. Look both ways and wait for the driver to signal approval to cross. A child must never attempt to return to the bus unless instructed to do so by the driver.

The district is required to follow the "No-Fault Law" for students receiving medical attention as a result of a school bus accident/incident. The "No-Fault Law" provides that if you are injured on a bus or a school bus in New York State, no-fault benefits must be paid by your auto-insurer, or if you have no auto, the auto insurance of a relative with whom you reside. The law further provides that you should only file a no-fault claim with the bus company if there is no such auto-policy in your household.

NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL BUS REQUESTS

In accordance with New York State Education Law, transportation request forms for children in non-public schools must be submitted by April 1st for the following school year to be eligible for transportation unless the family moves into the district after April 1st, in which case the request must be made within 30 days of establishing residency. Transportation requests received after April 1st are not guaranteed transportation. If transportation is provided based on a late request it will be to and from a central pick up and drop off location. Students must be 5 years of age by December 1 of the current school year to be eligible for bus transportation.

EMERGENCY "GO HOME" PROCEDURES

When, due to unusual circumstances, the Superintendent of Schools decides that it is necessary to close schools during the school day or before the usual time, the following procedures will be followed:

- Our radio stations may inform you of school closings.
- A School Messenger message will be sent. A posting will also be made on the district website and social media.
- Students who ordinarily walk will be dismissed immediately.
- All bus students will be transported to their usual bus stops

Please observe the following safety regulations:

- 1. Remain calm and stay at home.
- Please do not call the school or the Board of Education Office.
- 3. When possible, make every effort to be at the bus stop to meet your child. Students in Pre-K Grade 2 and all students taking special transportation must be met at the bus stop.
- 4. If you plan to be away from home at any time, your child should be made aware of another home where he or she can be cared for until your return.

DISMISSAL

Children will only be released to those individuals on the emergency blue card. Students in Pre-K - Grade 2 and all students taking special transportation must be met at the bus stop by a responsible person.

12:15PM - Balmville, Fostertown, Gardnertown, Horizons, New Windsor, and Pre-K at GAMS

SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

The days that the district is closed are noted on the district calendar. Any changes will be communicated via the district website, email, and robocall, posted on social media channels, and shared with local media as necessary.

Circumstances arise when schools and/or the entire district will need to close or dismiss early (weather, facilities issues, etc.). The Superintendent of Schools will decide on closing the schools in urgent and/or emergency situations. This decision is reached after careful consideration of the circumstance at hand (weather, facilities issue, etc.), taking multiple factors into account.

Parents and guardians should make sure their contact information is up to date in their Parent Portal (Infinite Campus) account to receive those messages directly. Community members should visit our website and follow our social media sites for important updates.

BULLYING AND HARASSMENT

The Board of Education is committed to providing an educational and working environment that promotes respect, dignity and equality. The Board recognizes that



discrimination, such as harassment, hazing and bullying, are detrimental to student learning and achievement.

These behaviors interfere with the mission of the district to educate its students and disrupt the operation of the schools. Such behavior affects not only the students who are its targets but also those individuals who participate and witness such acts.

To this end, the Board condemns and strictly prohibits all forms of discrimination, such as harassment, hazing and bullying on school grounds, school buses and at all school-sponsored activities, programs and events.

Discrimination, harassment, hazing or bullying that takes place at locations outside of school grounds which can be reasonably expected to materially and substantially interfere with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school or impinge on the rights of other students are prohibited, and may be subject to disciplinary consequences.

PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS

Pursuant to the Pesticide Notification Law, the Newburgh Enlarged City School District is informing through this written notice all persons in parental relation to our students that, during the course of the year, it might become necessary for a school to use pesticide products. The District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation who wish to receive 48- hour prior written notice of certain pesticide applications.

The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- anti-microbial products
- non-volatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- non-volatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- silica gel and other non-volatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate
- the application of EPA-designated biopesticides
- the application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40 CFR §152.25
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets

In addition, there will be no written notice of an application when a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours period following the application. In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good- faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your child's school, please complete the Pesticide Notice Form available on the district's website and return it to the school (please include your address, telephone #, e-mail address, and/or fax number).

APPR OF TEACHERS AND PRINCIPALS


In accordance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents/guardians of students have the right to request specific information about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers and/or principal, including the composite APPR score.

Right to Request and Review Information Regarding Teacher

In accordance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents/guardians of students have the right to request specific information about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. As the parent/guardian of a student in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District, you have the right to request the following information about your child's/children's teachers:

- whether the teacher has met New York State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas he or she teaches;
- whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which the State qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived;
- the teacher's college major;
- whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees;
- if your child is provided services by any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals, the services provided to your child and the aide's or paraprofessional's qualifications.

Requests for information about the qualifications of your child's/children's teacher(s) should be directed to the Main Office of the school of attendance. Thank you for your continued support and interest in your child's/children's education.

ANAPHYLAXIS

The Newburgh Enlarged City School District is legally authorized to employ Nurse Practitioners, School Nurse Teachers and Registered Nurses to provide the nursing service of administering anaphylactic treatment agents. All Nurse Practitioners, School Nurse Teachers and Registered Nurses employed by the Newburgh Enlarged City School District may administer epinephrine via a designated or an undesignated epinephrine auto-injector to an individual using professional judgment if an individual is experiencing a potentially life-threatening allergic reaction (anaphylaxis).


Each Nurse Practitioner, School Nurse Teacher and Registered Nurse will be covered by the non-patient specific standing order only while working in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District employment situation. This standing order will be in effect for one year, from September 1 until August 31. Each nurse will hold a current CPR Certification and will follow the Health Services Policy and Protocol for immunizations.

For an Anaphylactic Reaction to Immunizations, TB test, Allergens, Insect Bite, Exercised Induced or Idiopathic give:

For individuals 33 to 66 pounds, use one EpiPen Jr. (0.15 mL epinephrine injection, USP, 1:2000) auto-injector to deliver 0.15 mg of epinephrine injection.

For individuals approximately 66 pounds and greater, use one EpiPen® (0.3 mL epinephrine injection, USP, 1:1000) auto-injector to deliver 0.3 mg of epinephrine injection.

Call 911 and transport to Emergency Department via Ambulance. If not breathing and/or pulse ceases, begin CPR.





STUDENT PRIVACY AND DATA

Several laws and regulations protect the confidentiality of information about your children when that information identifies them. Such information, which includes student-specific data, is known as "personally identifiable information" or "PII."

The federal laws that protect your child's PII include the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA), the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). State laws, such as N.Y. Education Law 2-d and the related regulations of the N.Y. State Commissioner of Education; and the DOE Chancellor's Regulation A-820 also protect the confidentiality of your child's PII.

The NECSD is offering this form as a notice to opt-out of such releases for your student(s). Parents or guardians who would like their children to be featured and do not wish to opt-out do NOT need to take any further action at this time.

As the parent or guardian, I understand that if I opt-out, my child will be excluded from photos/videos and content posted on the district website, social media accounts, or print materials, including stories supplied by the district to local media. If you choose to opt out, please share this information with your child, so they can avoid being in photos taken in school when possible.

If you do not want your child to be featured in district media, please complete the form that can be found on the district website. This form should be completed each school year if you do not wish for your child to be photographed. A parent/guardian can opt-out or opt back in at any time. The school year is considered to be approximately from September 1st - August 31st. The list of those who opt-out and/or have rescinded a previous opt-out will be available to NECSD staff to reference as needed.

Note: This opt-out policy does not apply to public events, district yearbooks, or videotaping by security cameras in schools, on school grounds, or on school buses.
