JOB GOAL:

The Director of Middle Level Education is responsible for the administration, supervision, and management of curriculum and instruction duties and functions. The Director of Middle Level Education will implement a research based middle school model that is responsive to the needs of NECSD Students. The Director will provide successful transitions from the elementary and to the high school.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Research and implement a research based middle level model for the NECSD that is separate and apart from the NECSD adopted K-8 model.
- Address the middle level needs for K-8 schools.
- Works directly with the Assistant Superintendent to ensure complete fidelity of the curriculum at all middle schools.
- Facilitates cross-functional articulation among central office divisions.
- Works to forecast, plan, implement, and improve the middle school instructional program to support school improvement.
- Assists with the establishment of budget priorities for middle school programs.
- Examines student data from assessments and facilitates data dives to drive instruction across content areas in collaboration with school administrators.
- Participates in departmental staffing projections, staffing model recommendations, problem-solving, and development of policies and procedures.
- Inform principals of the progress of professional development needs and initiatives on a regular basis.
- Facilitates Professional development for teachers and Assistant Principals related to instructional support, strategies and skills...
- Assists with the coordination of promotion and awards.
- Assists with the development/communication and publication of curriculum materials, textbook recommendations, and course code directories.
- Assists with middle school Summer Bridge and Extended Learning planning.
- Coordinates departmental curricular revision, rewriting and course distribution.
- Conducts yearly inventory of teaching materials.
- Identifies, provides, and assists teachers in the development of curriculum-aligned classroom materials.
- Maintains close relationships with community agencies.
- Monitors middle school academic and related-arts textbook purchases.
- Plans and conducts curriculum meetings for the board of education.
- Advocates, facilitates, and monitors the alignment of curriculum, instruction, assessment, and improvement in the accomplishment of district goals.
- Plans and coordinates the Extended School Day and Extended School Year programs under Title I and the general fund for AIS and/or Talent Development purposes.
- Assists with the development and implementation of the District Curriculum Resources for all content areas.
- Participates in School Improvement planning.
- Participation/Facilitation at standing committees.
- Performs other related duties as required by the Superintendent.
- Coordinate a comprehensive transition event for students transitioning from elementary to middle as well as, from middle school to high school working with school leaders.
- Conducts an assessment of each middle school using the MYSMSA Essential Elements and develops a plan to acquire "schools to watch" status.
