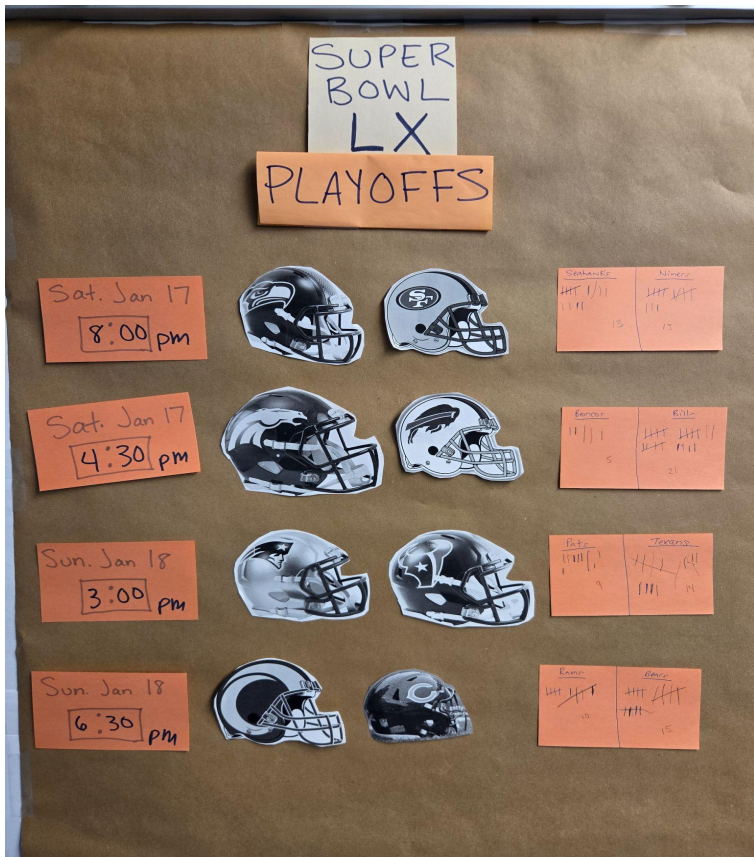
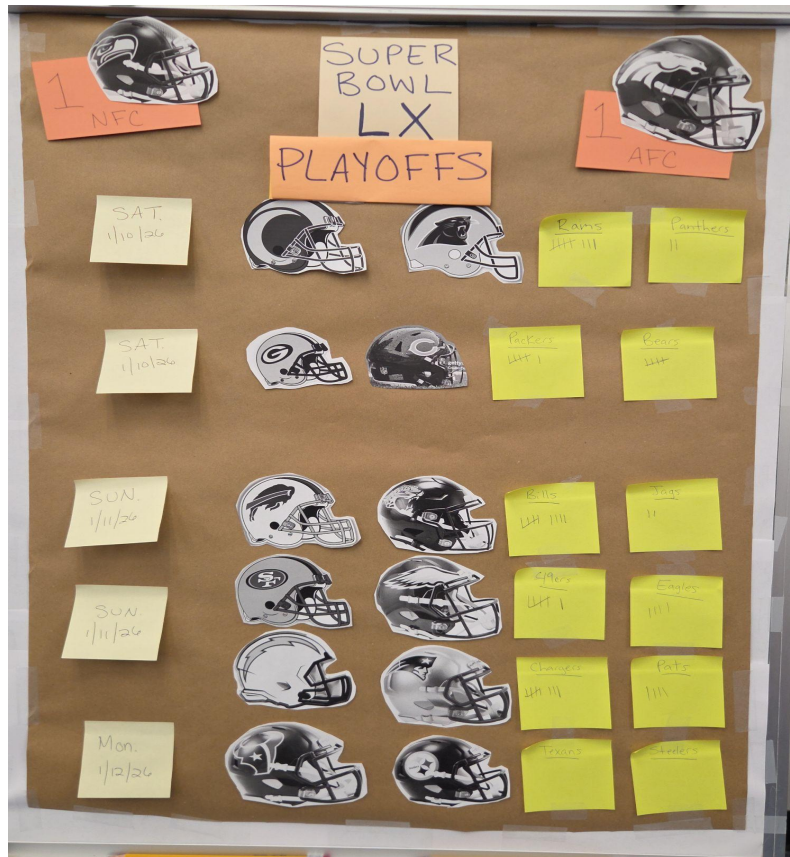
"School Counseling is a Work of Heart "

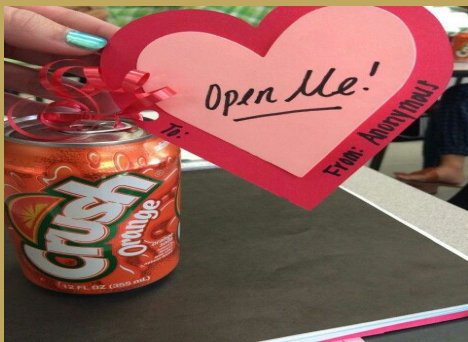

Guest Speaker Spotlight: Clean Beauty & Business Education

Our cosmetology program recently welcomed guest speaker Blaire Patterson, an esthetics educator-in-training and business owner based in New Windsor, who specializes in clean beauty and skincare. Ms. Patterson shared her expertise on the importance of clean, natural ingredients in skincare and advocated for making informed, health-conscious choices in the beauty industry.

In addition to discussing her journey as a business owner and certified eyelash technician, she engaged our junior and senior cosmetology students in meaningful conversations about entrepreneurship, branding, and career pathways in esthetics. Students had the opportunity to ask business-oriented questions and gain real-world insight into running a successful beauty business.

Ms. Patterson also conducted a live facial demonstration, providing students with hands-on learning and practical techniques aligned with industry standards. Her visit added tremendous value to our program and inspired students to think critically about both the technical and business sides of the beauty industry.

We look forward to continuing to welcome guest speakers in the upcoming months as we provide students with exposure to professionals across the beauty and wellness industry.



The art gallery exhibit "Art Meets Science" showed off art work from both STEAM: A Material Study and General Chemistry. Works included, a class Sierpinski triangle fractal, metal repousse, wire art, oxidized metallic paintings, ceramic tiles, fused glass, Japanese marbled paper, and states of matter pointillism. In addition, there were interactive exhibits where students could learn about Newton's cradle, domino toppling, laser light shows, kaleidoscopes and diffraction glasses.
