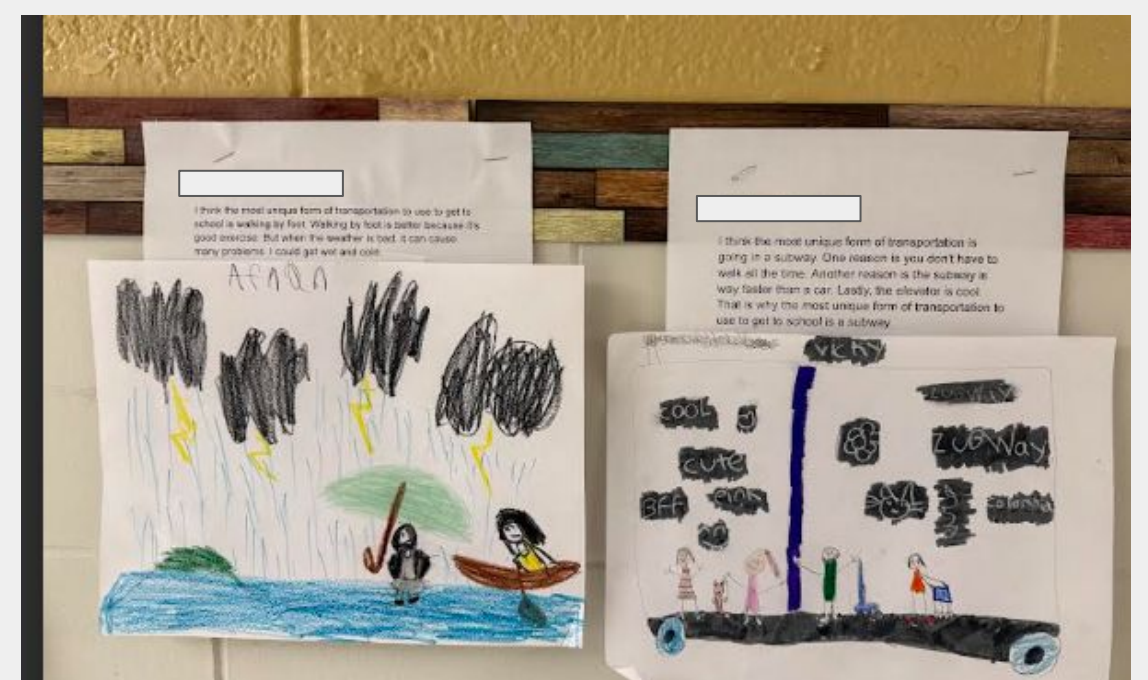
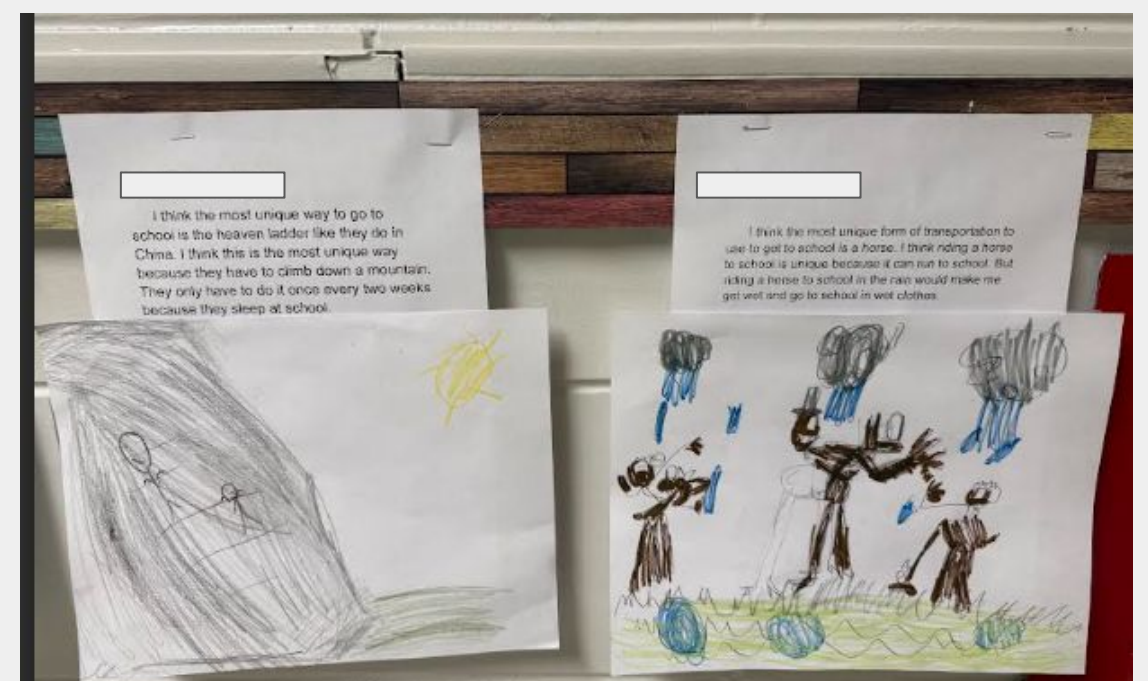
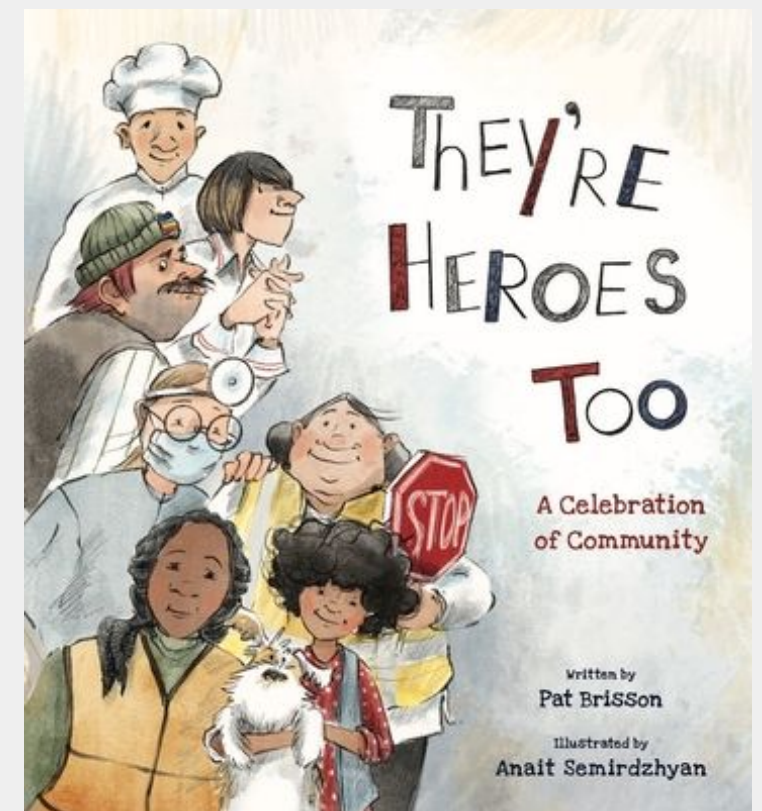


Ms. Herrera’s small group instruction!
