Instructional Focus

Questioning & Discussion: Collaboration

In many jobs around the world, people are being asked to work on and as a *team*. Work is no longer a solitary activity, but rather a group effort where people need to be able to collaborate in order to solve a problem and/or achieve a task. One of the ways we help students prepare for the working world (and for further education) is to teach students how to collaborate with one another.

This is why in many classrooms, students practice working in groups or with partners. They are not only learning the material, but also learning how to work with others, develop communication skills, and problem-solve.

One way to help students develop these skills at home is to provide opportunities for your family to work together solving a problem. This can be solving a puzzle together, playing a board game, or having a fun night out at an Escape Room activity. What's important in any of these problem-solving situations is that there is a clear goal, there is a leader who is able to delegate responsibilities (this shouldn't be the adult!), there's effective communication throughout, a chance to reflect on the *process* of solving the problem, and, of course, celebration on a job well done! These activities will not only help students develop this important skill, but can also provide for some fun family time!
